Do I need to have professional training? Professional training is a plus but not required. Tech team members are mentored through a training process. A teachable attitude, willingness to learn and eagerness to grow through feedback is the best avenue for training!

What skills should a *DeLighter* possess? *DeLights Team* members should be creative, attentive to detail, and enjoy working behind the scenes.

How often are *DeLights Team* **members needed?** Stage designs typically change every 4 to 8 weeks. *DeLighters* are asked to be available 4 times a year to assist with lighting design.
